- Characteristics of Asian civilizations: China, Japan, Korea, India, etc.

- Papers or panels may also address one of the seven ISCSC advocacy themes:
 - Comparative Civilizational Analysis
 - Social Resilience and Survival of Civilizations
 - Western Civilization and its Values
 - Climate Change Action
 - Confucian/Western Interactions
 - Islamic/Western Interactions
 - Democracy, Capitalism and Civic Engagement

Guide for Authors: Abstracts of up to 300 words are to be in English, using MS WORD, Times New Roman, 12-point font. Abstracts accepted for presentation will be included in Conference program materials. The Conference language will be English.

Please include your name, contact information, email, and professional affiliation details (or list as Independent Scholar) directly on the abstract document itself in addition to within your email message when sending. Approved papers will be presented by whomever submitted the abstract and in person at the Conference.

Important Dates: Firm deadline for abstract submission is May 1, 2025. Notification of acceptance for presentation at the conference will be approximately May 20, 2025. Late submissions may be considered only by request to the Program Chair and under exceptional circumstances.

Deadline: Firm Conference Registration deadline *for presenters* is June 25, 2025. This date is different from the abstract submission deadline.

Deadline: Firm Conference Registration deadline *for non-presenters* is July 15, 2025.

These important deadlines are in place to ensure that our hosts and the ISCSC have adequate time for arrangements; so that our Program Chair is able to coordinate the full conference program, and that timely notice can be given to all interested parties.
