**Guide for Authors:** Abstracts of up to 300 words are to be in English, using MS WORD, Times New Roman, 12-point font. Abstracts accepted for presentation will be included in Conference program materials. The Conference language will be English.

**Important Dates**: Firm <u>deadline for abstract submission is May 15, 2025</u>. Notification of acceptance for your presentation at the conference will be approximately June 1, 2025. Late submissions may be considered only by request to the Program Chair and under exceptional circumstances.

**Deadline**: Firm Conference Registration deadline *for presenters* is July 1, 2025. This date is different from the abstract submission deadline.

**Deadline:** Firm Conference Registration deadline for <u>non-presenters</u> is July 20, 2025.
